## **Spring Bird Banding**

The days are getting longer, flowers are blooming, and bird migration is happening! Join us for spring bird banding at Warner Park Nature Center to observe our federally licensed bird banders capture, band, and collect information about each bird's age and health. This long-term banding station is open to the public and has been on-going since 1983 to help us to understand bird populations and the importance of Warner Parks for birds.
